## **COMMUNITY CANTEENS**

Be Enriched operates Community Canteens across Southwark, Lambeth and Wandsworth. These are community meals, cooked by our wonderful volunteers using surplus ingredients. These meals offer a space where the community can come together, enjoy some delicious food and meet their neighbours.

Throughout this year, Be Enriched operated two of our Canteens; Castle canteen, and Graveney canteen. Our Battersea canteen remained closed.



We continued our work from the previous year, distributing meals and food parcels to residents whilst working under COVID guidance. The community continued to support us in our work. We were donated an E-cargo bike which enabled us to deliver food quickly, and more sustainably.

In May 2021, we were able to reopen our canteen for guests to be able to sit inside and enjoy a sit-down lunch once again.

Tooting canteen also celebrated 8 years of being open in and serving the community in 2021.

#### Castle Canteen

Castle canteen remained closed until we were able to reopened in August 2021.

We slowly but surely gained back our community of guests who began to attend on a regular basis, building back our numbers to 15-20 guests per session.









# WANDSWORTH FOOD PARTNERSHIP

#### London Food Roots Incubator Programme

The Wandsworth Food Partnership began to take part in the Food Roots Incubator Programme. The programme was facilitated by the GLA, Sustain, and Food Matters. The programme aimed to help food partnerships develop and grow after the pandemic, increasing community resilience to emergency responses, making sustainable collaborations, and more partnership growth.

We took part in regular workshops focusing on food insecurity and partnership development, learning from industry experts as well as our peers.

The Food Partnership also began hosting virtual meetings for members of the partnership to attend, to reunite members and to invite new attendees to have their say in how the partnership should be run.

Worrying About Money Leaflet
We collaborated with IFAN, and several
other Wandsworth-based organisations to
create a leaflet with a 3-step process to
help residents with money issues.





# THE FOOD BUS

#### 'The Food Bus is finally on the road!

After severe delays in the project due to COVID, the Food Bus had its first trip out in June 2021. The team had previously been supporting the COVID response work that both Be Enriched and BPK had been conducting across South London.

Whilst the team had been waiting for the Bus to be ready, they focused on engaging communities who would be using the bus in the future. They began working with local schools, and using the van to bring produce right to peoples doorsteps.

Unfortunately, the Bus was vandalised soon after we had the Bus on the road. The community rallied together to help us out in anyway they could. This lead to us securing our secure parking spot which Hadley Homes provided for us.





## VOLUNTEERING

During October 2020 - September 2021 was a very challenging time for both Be Enriched and the service users as the new COVID guideline were frequently introduced and the charity had to put these into practice to deliver the project. Be Enriched continued the Food Hub in Wandsworth which prepare food parcel and provide our home delivery service to those shielding at home. We had a great team of volunteers who continued to work with us from earlier on in our COVID response. They helped us to continue our work until we were able to reopen our canteens.

Over this period, we had a total of 136 individuals volunteers with Be Enriched across our projects.

# BRIXTON PEOPLES KITCHEN

2020-2021 was a rollercoaster for Brixton People's Kitchen. BPK entered the new year by serving their community throughout the entire festive period, providing over 100 free Christmas dinners from their community shop and Cafe in Kennington - as well as gifts, festive treats and toys.

In the months that followed BPK supported over 600 households and opened their space 6 days a week to the local community. Providing nutritious affordable meals daily, a safe space for people to come together, and free school meals every half term and school holiday. All the while navigating the ripple effects of a year of lock-downs, ever-changing Covid regulations, and supply chain issues due to Brexit.

In April 2021 the rug was swiftly pulled from underneath BPK as they were served notice on their community space and were given just three months to pack away and shut up shop.

Despite being without a home, BPK still delivered every single planned project during the Summer Holiday. Providing over 3000 meals for school children and executing our Summer Holiday Takeover at St Anselm's Church. Which provided five weeks of free workshops, activities, and lunches for young people aged 8-16.

# THE FUTURE

The pandemic has affected our work for longer than we every expected, with more people engaging with our projects than ever before.

Be Enriched will be moving away from our emergency response into a more sustainable method of working, learning from our experiences from COVID.

We have begun working with the GLA and will be for the next year, helping us to become more resilient and use our resources in the most efficient way. We are also continuing our work promoting a Cash First approach.

More energy will be focused on our Food Bus, getting that out on the road and making sure we are reaching those who are most in need.
